

Restraint and Seclusion Annual Review 2014-15

Annual Reporting Requirements

The annual reporting requirements for the Use of Physical Restraint and Seclusion are outlined in **OAR 581-021-0559**. Each entity that has jurisdiction over a public education program must prepare an annual report detailing the use of physical restraint and seclusion for the preceding school year. All elements of that requirement are detailed in this report.

Each entity that has jurisdiction over a public education program shall make its annual report about physical restraint and seclusion available to:

- The public at the entity's main office
- The website of the entity
- The school board overseeing the entity
- Parents and guardians of students in a public education program, who shall be advised at least once each school year about how to access the report.

In addition – beginning in the 2013-14 school year all district will submit their restraint and seclusion data to the Oregon Department of Education as part of the consolidated collections process.

Restrain and Seclusion Policy

Crook County School District readopted **JGAB** Use of Physical Restraint and Seclusion policy and **JGAB-AR** on June 18th, 2012. This policy and administrative regulation outlines the procedures for the use of physical restraint and seclusion including reporting forms for incidents and debriefing notes.

Non-violent physical restraint

The Crook County School District has selected the CPI (Crisis prevention Intervention) training program of physical restraints and seclusion for use in the district. As required by State

regulation **OAR 581-021-0563**, this program includes behavior support, prevention, de-escalation, and crisis response techniques. Any program selected by the district must be in compliance with state and federal law with respect to the use of restraint and/or seclusion.

In September 2014 Crook County School District sent a staff member to be trained as a trainer for the district. This staff member held both new and review training for administrators and staff during the 2014-15 school year.
